For survivors of sex trafficking, freedom is just the first step. Healing takes time—often years—and without long-term care, the cycle of exploitation too often continues. The road to restoration is not short, and without a stable place to heal, survivors are left vulnerable.

And yet, there simply aren't enough places for them to go.

Hope Center Indy exists to bridge this gap, offering short-term, long-term, and transitional housing programs where survivors can rebuild their lives physically, emotionally, and spiritually. With compassionate care, trauma-informed therapy, and life skills training, survivors don't just exit trafficking; they find the hope and healing to truly thrive.

80% of survivors without safe housing are re-victimized.

Coming out of a crisis can be deeply overwhelming, and many survivors are not ready to commit to long-term restorative care programs. This often creates an additional barrier to accessing help.

Our team recognized this need and developed a response: safe nights or short-term housing options that provide immediate support without requiring long-term commitments. With increased funding, partnerships, renovations, and new hires, we were able to expand our capacity and open our doors wider than ever before.

Thanks to our strengthened network, survivors from anywhere in the United States can now call us for access to safe, short-term housing. Our national partnerships enable us to coordinate free, safe travel for survivors, so that they can reach safety on the very same day they reach out for help. We also accept same day referrals from law enforcement to further support survivors at critical moments when immediate action is needed.

IN 2024, RATHER THAN EXPANDING INTO NEW AREAS OF SERVICE, WE CHOSE TO INVEST MORE BOLDLY IN OUR EXISTING PROGRAMS, STRENGTHENING THEIR REACH AND EFFECTIVENESS.

WE WORKED WITH 58 PARTNERS LOCALLY AND NATIONALLY TO ESTABLISH A RESIDENTIAL CARE PROVEN PROCESS TO MEET SURVIVORS WHERE THEY ARE, OFFERING REFUGE AND SHARING THE HOPE OF JESUS DURING MOMENTS OF DESPERATION.






GRACE WINS: HOPE'S JOURNEY OF COURAGE AND TRANSFORMATION

Hope Center Indy has taken careful consideration in the collection and sharing of this story. To preserve her privacy, our graduate has chosen to represent herself as "Hope" throughout this narrative. All content is shared with the explicit, informed consent of its owner.

An out-of-state flight, her first plane ride, to an unfamiliar place called Indiana marked the start of Hope's journey at Hope Center's Take Heart Residential (THR). "Before I got on the plane to come here, I asked God to give me a sign that this was the right move for me. It was a little over a two-hour flight here. I'd never been on a plane; in fact, I had never been inside an airport before. To say I was anxious is an understatement," said Hope.

From the very beginning, Hope's courage was clearly evident. Despite the challenges looming on the horizon, she bravely navigated her new environment at Hope Center Indy, often relying on non-verbal forms of communication. "She was much quieter; she kept her head down and would not always look at other people. We all became experts in reading Hope's non-verbal communication," Jenn Starr, the Director of Residential Ministries, observed. Hope also shared, "I came here a terrified, mute, and untrusting little girl. A turtle in her shell, safe but alone. In my experience, people who pretended to love and care about me only wanted something in return. But that isn't true here."

Jenn remembers the evenings spent painting Christmas ornaments, making crafts, including lots of diamond art, playing games, and talking. One night, they sat on the couch and talked an hour and a half together. These moments became especially precious as Hope chose to stay behind while other residents participated in different activities, not feeling quite ready to join.

What sets Hope apart is her remarkable perseverance. Due to the severity of the trauma she had endured, she was enrolled in THR's long-term restorative care program for an extended period. Hope faced every obstacle with unwavering resilience. "When she was tired, she kept going. When she wasn't sure, she kept going. When she felt like she didn't deserve it, she kept going. With little or no sleep, she kept going. When she hit a wall, she kept going. She would hit another wall after another, and the staff felt each of them too because we were right there with her; she kept going." Jenn recounts.

"This program is hard; I never thought that I'd make it to graduation. I wanted to leave a few times. There were times when I was so depressed that I became suicidal. But at my lowest, loving people rallied around me, and they never left me. I have the love and support here I've always needed and hoped for." said Hope.

As Jenn learned through playing games like Sequence, Hope's approach to challenges was to maintain steadiness and positivity and, most importantly, never harbor a hint of revenge despite her deep pain.

"I learned from Hope when we first played those games together to stay steady, whether winning or losing, and finish the game. That is what she did with THR; she stayed steady. She was always positive even in the depths of pain, with not one ounce of revenge; she kept going! She loved more, believed more, grew closer with the Lord, and finished the race with our program!"

Hope's graduation was a recognition of both her completion of the program and her incredible transformation. By opting for a purple butterfly theme, she chose to beautifully symbolize the profound change she had experienced in every detail of her celebration. Hope Center's Associate Director, Mary Nolen, highlighted the significant milestones in Hope's journey and emphasized the power of God's love and compassion in facilitating healing and renewal.

"We're so thankful tonight that we have an incredible reason to rejoice. Satan tries to knock all of us down, but he is not the victor. Jesus Christ gives victory. Tonight, we celebrate the victory that Jesus has given to Hope. We're celebrating what our God can do," Mary proclaimed during the ceremony.

Hope's transformation was undeniable. "From walking with your head down, to smiling and greeting people in the hallways, to talking with customers in the boutique, and even last December, speaking in front of a room of over 100 people. I was amazed to see you use your voice in a bold way, and it was one of the most beautiful things I had ever witnessed," said Mary, as Hope smiled brightly from the table across the stage.

"Being here has given me so much hope and started me on the road to healing. I've done so many things that I never dreamed I'd ever be able to do. I've learned so much here. One of the hardest is that I can do hard things even though I'm afraid; changing and healing are hard, but so is staying the same. You just have to choose your hard. I think the biggest thing I've learned is that I don't have to be ashamed of my scars or my story."

"What an honor it has been to see from week to week, month to month, and even year to year, the transforming work God has done in you. Hope, you have persevered, and you have fought the fight. Beyond her perseverance and transformation, Hope's capacity for love and compassion was ever-flowing. It was apparent in how deeply she connected with everyone. On numerous occasions, Mary remembers how Hope embraced others in the Prayer Center, comforted those shedding tears, and congratulated peers for their courage in sharing with the group. Her warm hugs and bright smiles are now treasured gifts to all at the center. Without a doubt, many in the room on any given day find delight in hearing Hope's laughter.

"God has done many amazing things in my life since I've been here. The most important is proving that I am, in fact, loveable. I look around the room and see the faces of people who care about and love me unconditionally. Mere words can't express my gratitude," said Hope. "Being here has given me so much hope and started me on the road to healing. I've done so many things that I never dreamed I'd ever be able to do. I've learned so much here. One of the hardest is that I can do hard things even though I'm afraid; changing and healing are hard, but so is staying the same. You just have to choose your hard. I think the biggest thing I've learned is that I don't have to be ashamed of my scars or my story."

Just days before her graduation, Hope took a bold step toward her future by enrolling in college to study for a nursing degree. She embraced the opportunity to learn how to drive through lessons provided by a board member of the Hope Center and decided to enroll in Hope Community, the center's transitional housing program for graduates.

During her speech at her graduation, Hope encouraged her fellow residents, "To my sisters in the program, I want to encourage you not to give up. If I can do this, I really believe you can too."

"You might have been struck down," said Mary, "but you are not destroyed. Jesus has more to say."

OUR HOPE COMMUNITY TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAM SERVES AS A CRUCIAL BRIDGE FOR WOMEN TRANSITIONING FROM RESTORATIVE CARE PROGRAMS, OFFERING VITAL SUPPORT AS THEY REINTEGRATE INTO THE COMMUNITY.

Survivors of trauma can face significant challenges if they lack stable support systems or resources after completing restorative care programs. Research shows that without adequate post-program support, individuals exposed to trauma may experience prolonged hardships, heightening their risk of distress and a potential relapse into previous harmful patterns. Providing stable housing, ongoing access to care, and community-based resources is vital to supporting lasting recovery and long-term healing.

As a transitional housing program, Hope Community provides residents with freedom and high accountability, naturally resulting in lower turnover compared to programs serving individuals earlier in their healing journey. The residents of Hope Community are focused on reintegration and independent living.

Dan and Kendra Leary VOLUNTEERS OF HOPE


Dan and Kendra Leary met in chorus class their freshman year at Greenfield Central High School.

"I'm energized knowing that I'm not just picking up food or turning a wrench or mowing the grass or moving office furniture. I am helping to provide a safe place for women in dire circumstances beyond their control."

Along with helping women in need, volunteering at Hope Center Indy has allowed Dan and Kendra to grow as a couple. From their high school chorus class to volunteering, the Learys continue to strengthen their relationship and support each other by sharing common causes.

INNOVATION CENTER

A few years ago, Jake Flagle relocated his office and engineering lab to the Hope Center campus in an effort to explore ways to create long-term employment opportunities for residents of the Hope Center. What started as a small operation quickly turned into something beyond his imagination.

Jake's vision has now flourished into partnerships with multiple companies through 316 Contract Manufacturing.



One of the most exciting collaborations is with Compact Medical to produce the Butterfly Bag Valve Mask (ButterflyBVM). This innovative medical device, designed to revolutionize CPR practices and save countless lives, embodies the Hope Center's mission to impart hope and healing to every heart.

For Jake, the work at the Hope Center is about creating lasting change in the lives of the women the ministry serves. He describes the four pillars that guide his vision for contract manufacturing at the Hope Center: World-Class Products, Work as Worship, Creating Pathways for Upward Mobility, and Financial Support for the Ministry.





The future is exciting and filled with potential. Jake and the team envision scaling operations through vertical integration and the creation of **an innovation center.** But always, staying open to God's plans and following wherever He leads.

"Never in a million years would I have dreamed we'd be building medical devices here. I could have seen us assembling consumer electronics or goods, but to become an FDA-registered facility producing lifesaving devices? That's something only God could orchestrate. It's not just about the work we do here; it's about the lives being changed. It's about seeing the women grow, heal, and discover their God-given purpose. That's why we do what we do. I'm continually amazed at what happens here. God's fingerprints are all over this place, and I'm just thankful to be along for the journey." -Jake

When we first partnered with **Jordan Detection K-9** to house an electronic storage detection training facility on our campus, we couldn't have fully imagined the profound impact it would have in the fight to end human trafficking.

The K-9s are trained in electronic storage detection, which enables them to identify a specific chemical commonly used in electronic devices such as phones and laptops. The dogs' training in electronic storage detection begins with their handler associating food rewards with the successful storage detection. Through this process, basic cues and advanced commands are instilled. This skill makes them a valuable asset to law enforcement during search warrants. Their dedication and hard work have led to numerous arrests in human trafficking, child pornography, and other crimes.

- 1,412 Search warrants
- 1,214 Search warrants resulting in the location of electronic evidence
- 962 Suspects arrested
- 199 Survivors recovered

These statistics only represent the work of K-9 teams under the sponsorship of our partners at Our Rescue. We estimate that the cumulative figures, including teams that trained on our campus but work with other organizations, are much higher. Our collaboration with Jordan Detection K-9 and law enforcement vastly extends our impact, enabling us to impart hope and help to an increasing number of people worldwide.





"I would like to share briefly how the Spirit of the Lord led my wife and me to become supporters of Hope Center Indy.

It was in the Spring of 2018, and we had the radio on in our home, west of Zionsville.

It wasn't like we were sitting and listening to the radio, but suddenly it became apparent that the radio host was interviewing a young man who was reporting on a Christian ministry for young women located on the East side of Indianapolis. That young man, as it turned out, was David Nolen.

David's comments about Hope Center Indy were inspirational and, maybe inspired. That said, together with his enthusiasm and the content, I was prompted to check out the Hope Center website. In several email exchanges with David, I posed a sequence of questions, and David promptly and quite sufficiently answered them.



David's responses were so timely and transparent that I finally felt bold enough to ask for financial statements, which he promptly provided. Needless to say, I was impressed.

Then, to get more background, I searched the Brookville Road Community Church website, wanting to make sure the church founded by Pastor Hubert had sound theology.

Next came a Saturday morning tour. I met David in person and his humility was evident. The tour was impressive. I had visited this facility owned by another ministry back in the mid-1990s, and the facilities at that time were in deplorable condition. So I was impressed with the care and improvements made by the Hope Center since the mid-'90s.

I wanted my wife, Judy, to meet David and Pastor Hubert, and due to her health, they were willing to visit us at our home, where we asked more questions. Their answers resonated with us, and we prayed together.

In May 2018, we became financial supporters of Hope Center Indy, all because the Lord saw fit to introduce David and this ministry to us a couple of months earlier. And little did we know, of course, that we would learn so much more about David Nolen and his family at the Celebration of David's Life a year later.
